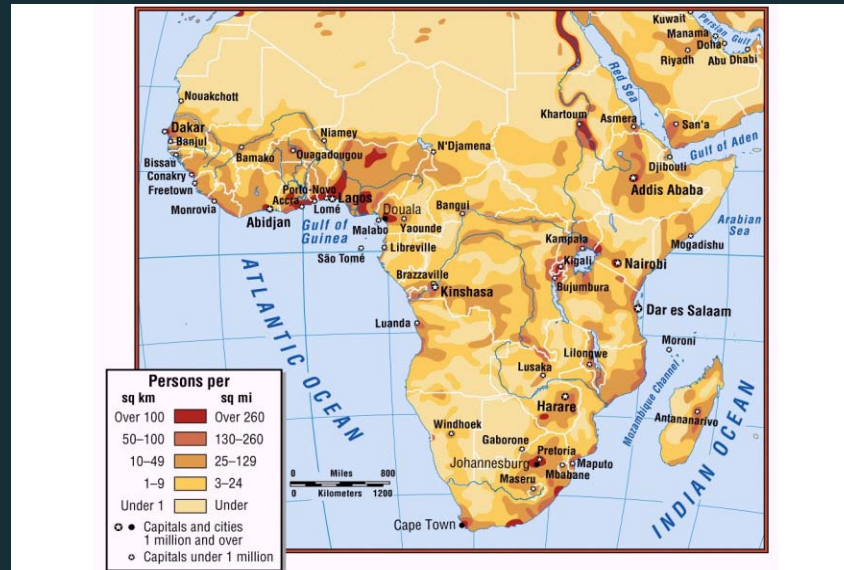

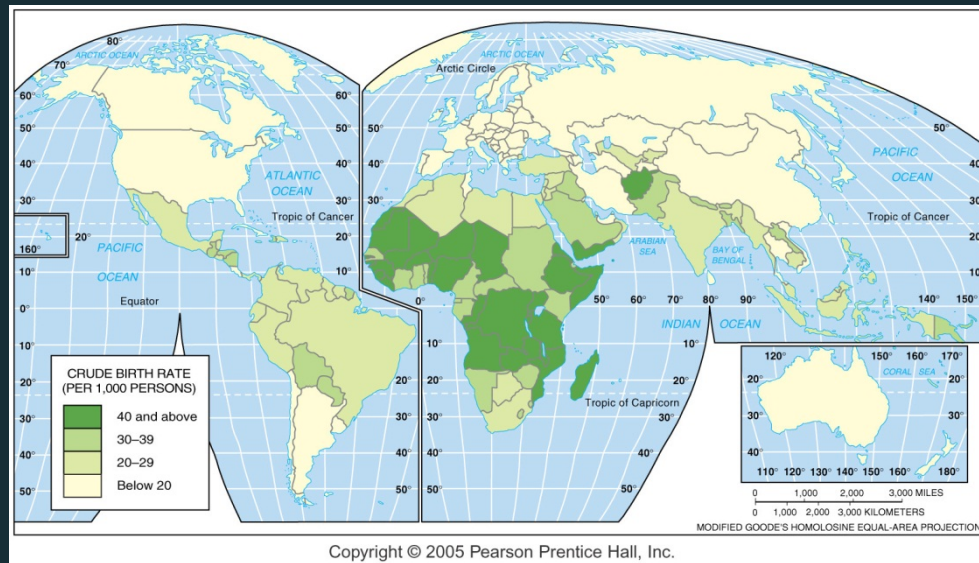

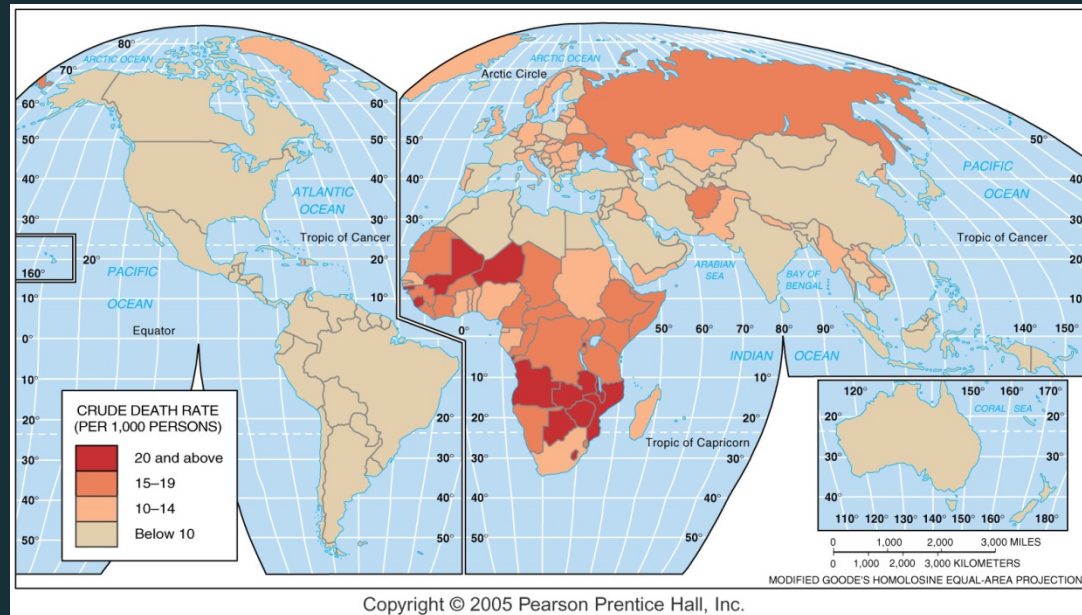


Crude Birth Rate Map



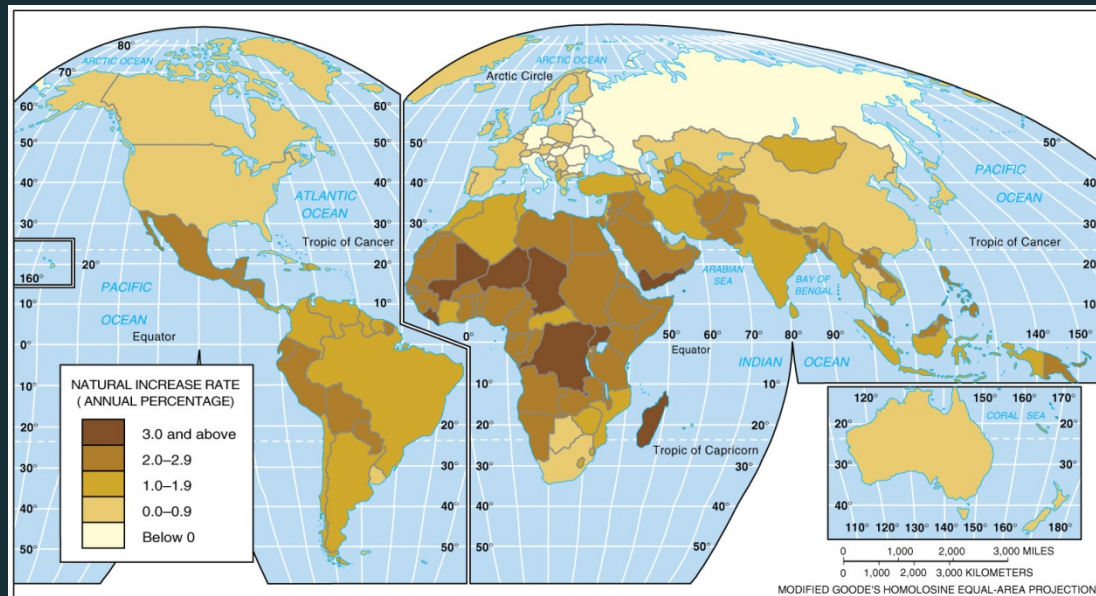

Crude Death Rate Map



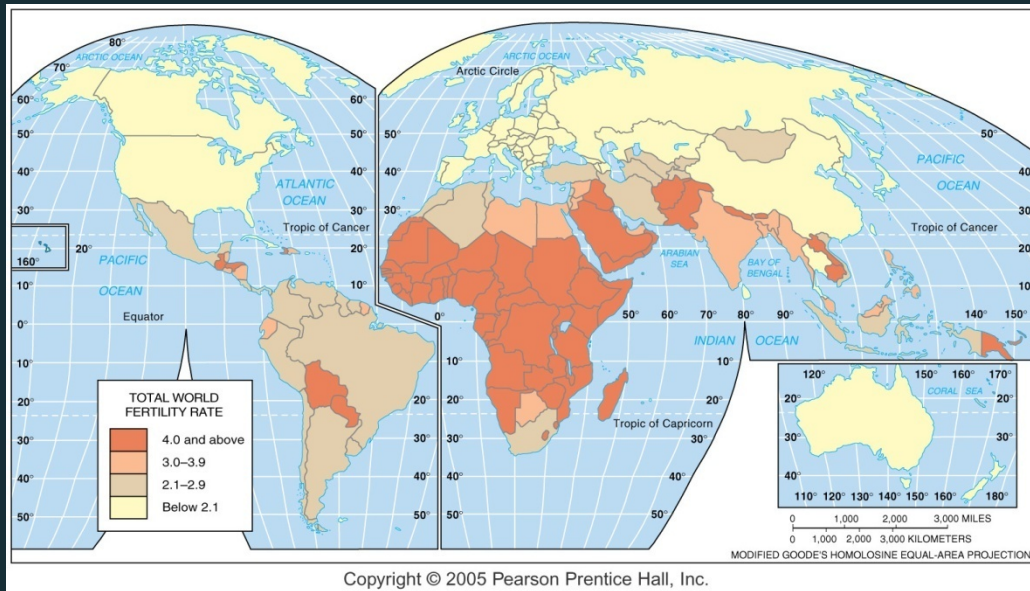

Natural Increase Map

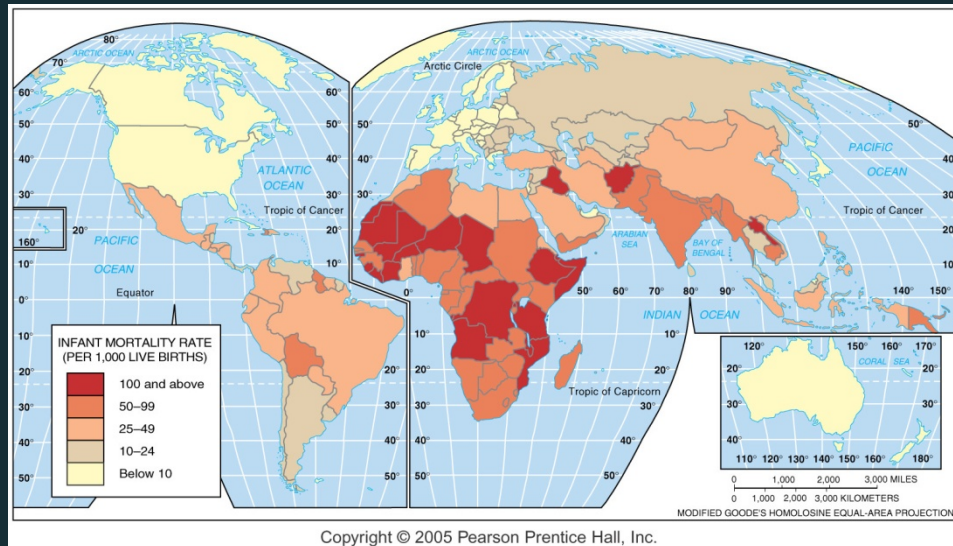

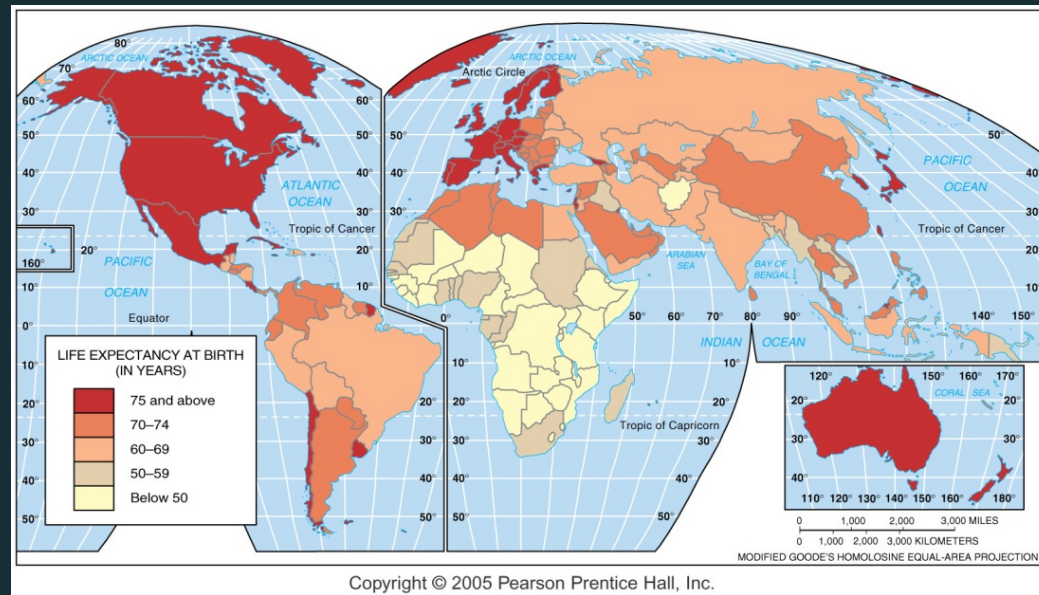
Total Fertility Rate

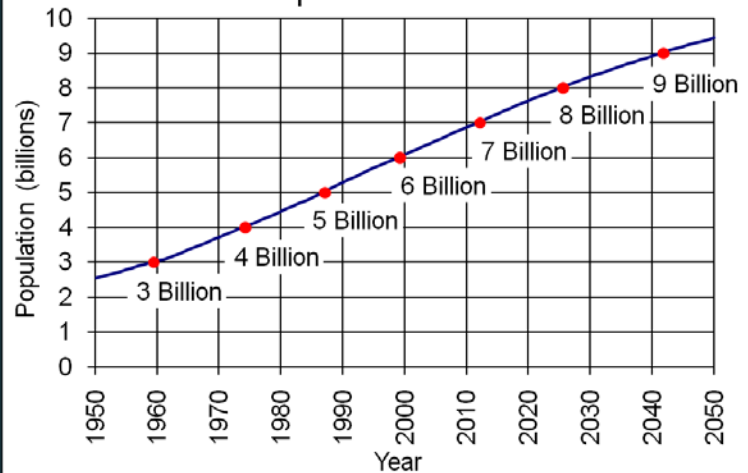

1950-2050



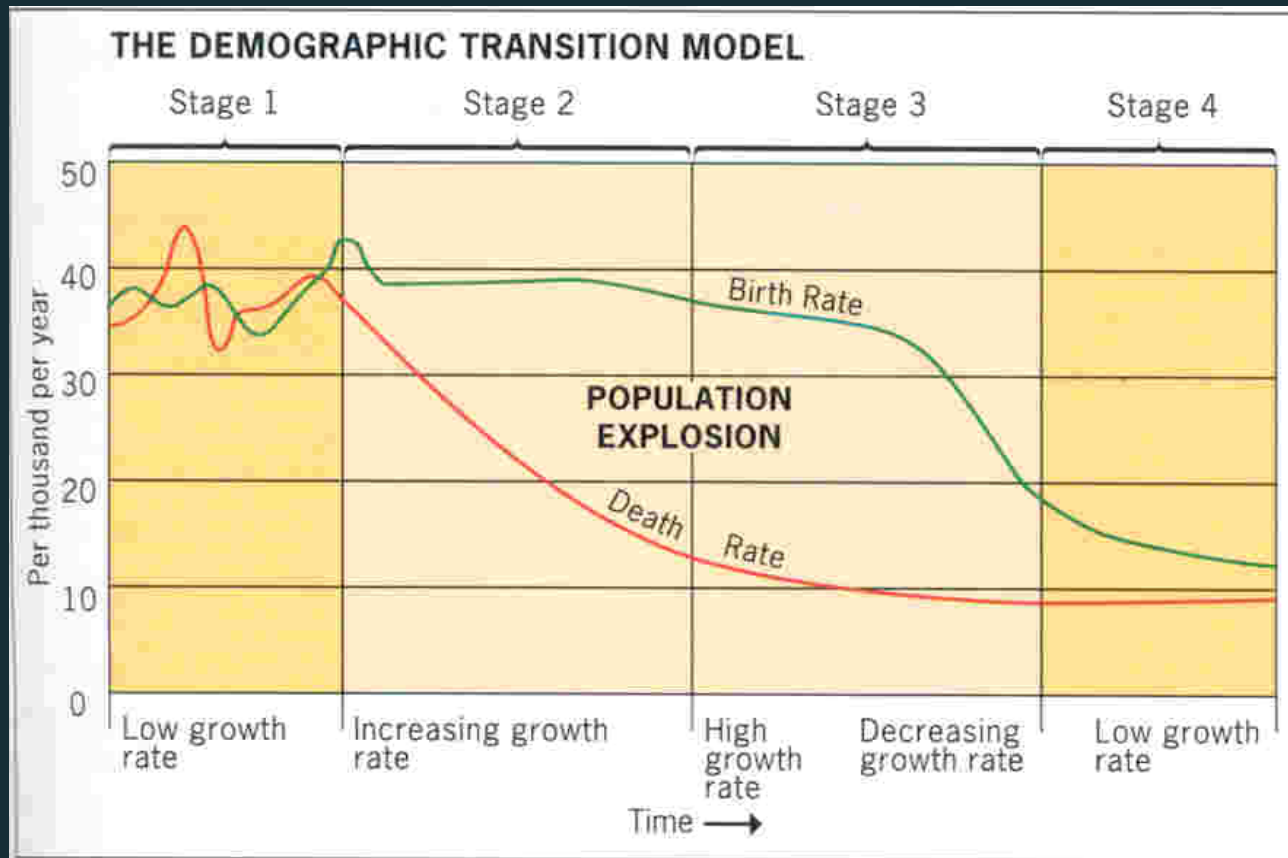

World Population: 1950-2050

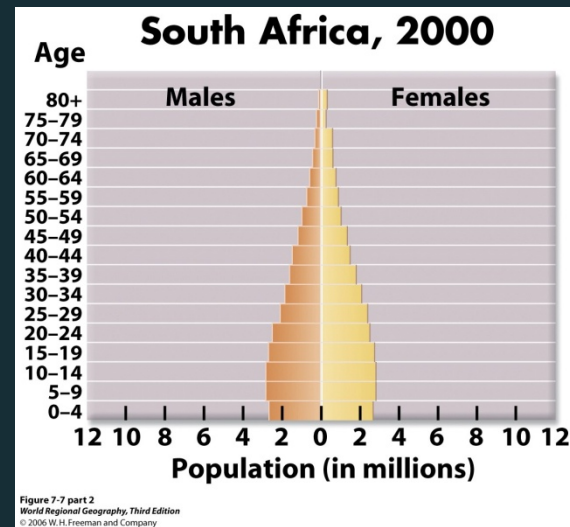
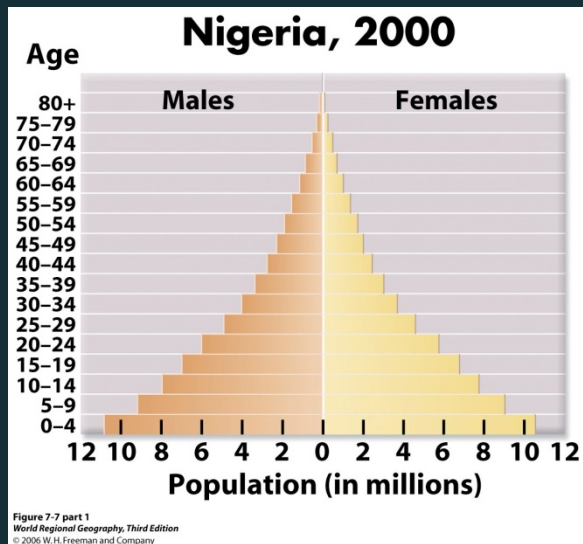

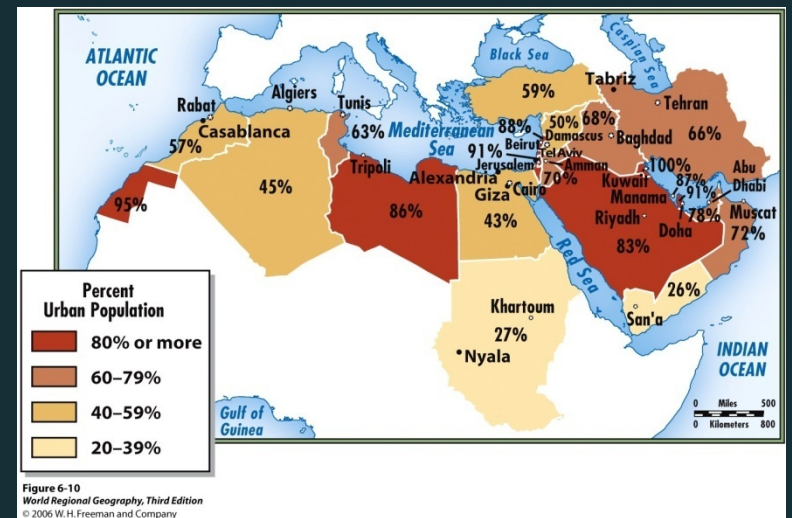
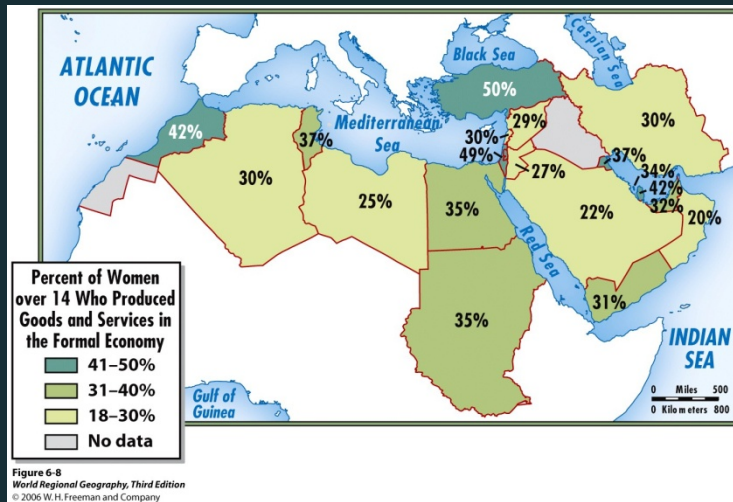
Demographic Transition Model



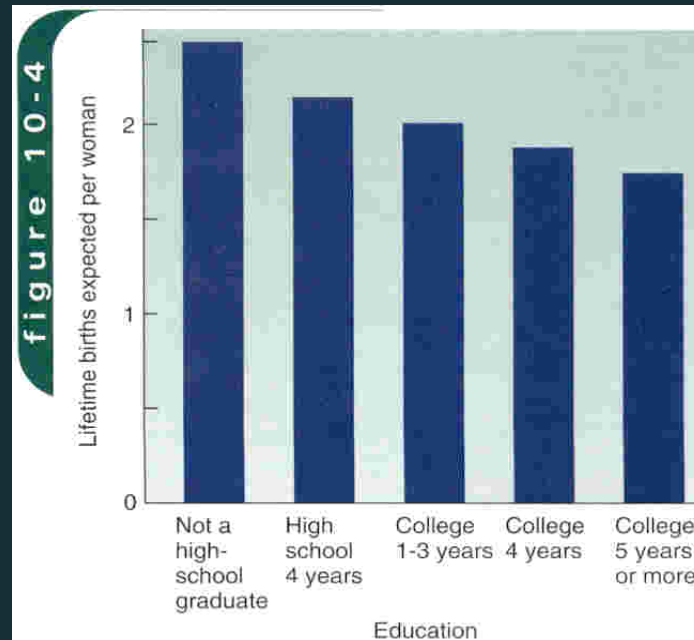
