Course Information

Course Components	Throughout the duration of the course each student will complete the items listed below for a grade. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Reaction Papers (20pts each)• Presentation (100pts)• Term Paper (100pts)
University Components	Each student must complete the following as required by the university: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Watson-Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal.• Global Survey
Reaction Papers	Each student will complete a one-page, single-spaced, paper on several topics discussed in the course. When assigned, the paper is due at the following class meeting. Failure to turn in a reaction paper will result in a zero for that assignment. No late papers will be accepted. There are 14 reaction papers that will be assigned throughout the session.
Presentation	Each student will deliver a 3-5 minute presentation concerning a topic assigned in the course.
Miscellaneous	The following is a list of important components for the semester. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• All reaction papers must be one page in length (single-spaced) with the assignment title on the first line, name provided under the title, and handed in at the next class meeting. Failure to submit the papers on the date due will result in an F.• Writing style, grammar, and other writing skills are the student's responsibility. The main points and critical thinking will be of great importance. The overall score of each paper will be determined from your ability to write a well-prepared and thoughtful paper.• Plagiarism is not tolerated and will result in an F for the course.
