Dublin was okay just as long as you didn't mix it up with Louth. With Fermanagh and Tyrone it was hard to remember which was which. I stared at the map of Ireland from the top to the bottom. There was nowhere I wanted to run away to, except maybe some of the islands. I was still going to do it though. You couldn't run away to an island; you had to sail or swim part of the way. On both days I need the group to fill in a sheet with this information; by the 2nd half of 2 Feb., you will present a group Powerpoint (6-10 slides, no more than 20 seconds/slide) illustrating (a–c), with the last slide being your sources for the Powerpoint.
